Monday 18th of May

Visit to Hadeland Glassverk.

Hadeland Glassverk was founded in 1762 and is a leader in glass design. Designers and glassblowers are continually testing the limits of their art in the glass factory. Everything is mouth-blown by their eminent glassblowers. Hadeland Glassverk is one of Norway's biggest tourist attractions and here we will enjoy a guided tour followed by lunch served at one of their eateries. In addition they have a total of nine shops which welcome you to shop at factory prices or to just browse around.

Tuesday 19th of May

Visit to the Norwegian Opera & Ballet in Oslo.



Did you know that the stage in The Norwegian Opera & Ballet is 16 meters below sea level? It was officially opened on the 12th of April 2008 and has a gross area of 38.500 m² divided into 1.100 rooms. During a guided tour you will get information about everything from the building process and the fabulous architecture, to what happens on the stage before the curtains goes up. Lunch will be served in their brasserie at 11:45 offering a wonderful view of the Oslofjord.

Maxi taxi leaves the hotel at 10:30

Return by foot back to the hotel walking the main street Karl Johan and seeing attractions such as Stortinget (The Parliament) and Slottet (The Royal Castle). If you prefer to take a taxi we will help you.

In the evening we will join the other delegates for a boat trip to Holmen Fjordhotel, bus to the quay leaves the hotel at 16:45.

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Wednesday 20th of May

Visit to the Norsk Folkemuseum.

The Norwegian Culture Museum features an open air museum and large indoor collections. It is situated only 15 minutes away by bus at the sea front at a place called Bygdø. Bygdø is one of the most fashionable places to live in Oslo.

The museum covers a large area and show buildings from our ancient history. We shall only see at part of it, so don't worry...

Those attending the World Driving Championship will join us all day. Lunch will be served at the Museum.
